First we discuss Title participation, Title 1 requirements, parents rights to be involved, parent/student contracts, programs for migrants, ELL, and Homeless students. After reviewing the School-wide Title program, we revisit the annual review meeting conducted at the end of the previous school year. Next, we discuss opportunities for improvement both how we provide services and involve parents in the program. In addition, we discuss plans for hosting engagement nights. To conclude, we discuss ways to improve communications between family and school.

Describe method(s) for identifying barriers

Based on parent feedback, the most significant barrier is that multiple sports and activities overlap, making it difficult for families to attend. Therefore, we always try to combine our family nights with another activity to increase attendance.

Describe method(s) for identifying needs

The district supports student success with Title 1.A. funds by providing the following service delivery models and instructional programs: RTI, (K-2) Pathways to Reading, Guided Reading, Guided Math, and Positive Behavior Support Systems in combination with Leader in Me Habits. The staff in our elementary building will receive ongoing professional development to meet the needs of all student. Title funds will be used to purchase material utilized by students and staff on a daily basis.

Teachers will communicate with parents to ensure a complete understanding of these programs. This happens during Back to School Night, Parent-Teacher Conferences, in addition to ongoing to communications between teacher and parents.

Strategies to support successful school and family interactions
